U.S. Congressman Tim Bishop made an appearance and praised the Veterans who were present. Also a representative of the NHL New York Islanders and a local artist, Dennis Coburn, were present and contributed articles for an auction. To top it all off Santa Claus arrived via fire truck and gave each child a small gift.

Two distinguished members of the Port Jefferson Lodge #2138, Robert McClean, Lodge Trustee Chairman and Edward M. Lee, Past District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler and Lodge Sponsor each received a commendation from U.S. Congressman Tim Bishop for their outstanding and continuing service to our Veterans.

Robert McClean received recognition for his chairing the "Stickball Tournament" which raised \$12.000 to be divided among 6 Veterans and care packages that were donated to the 101st Airborne Unit in Afghanistan.
