## 2013 New York State Soccer Shoot Schedule & Details

October 1st, 2013 – All Lodge and District Competitions need to be completed. October 5th & 6th, 2013 – State Regional Events\* must be completed. Contact the host District's Chairperson for details.

- --Zone 1 consists of the Central, North Central, Ontario and South Central Districts. The Regional Shoot is scheduled to be hosted by the South District.
- --Zone 2 consists of the East, East Central, Mid Hudson, South and Southeast District. The Regional Shoot is scheduled to be hosted by the Mid Hudson District.
- -Zone 3 consists of the North, North Hudson, Northeast and State Capital Districts. The Regional Shoot is scheduled to be hosted by the North District.
- --Zone 4, consisting of the Southwest, Southern Tier, West, and West Central Districts - Regional Shoot is scheduled to be hosted by the West District.

October 19th, 2013 – the New York State Championship\* will be hosted by Rochester Lodge #24.

# Elks National Foundation Community Investments

-Beacon Grants - are \$2,000 grants available to every Lodge. These grants offer Lodges an opportunity to develop a new, ongoing, charitable, Elks-driven community project

--Gratitude Grants - are \$2,000 grants available to Lodges that meet the GER's per capita goal. These grants can be used to serve a variety of community needs

--Promise Grants - are also \$2,000 grants available to the first 500 lodges that promise to hold a youth event.

 Impact Grants - are competitive grants of up to \$10,000 designed to help Lodges make a visible, significant and ongoing difference in their communities.

# ENF Increases Awards

ENF increased funding for the Most Valuable Student scholarship program for the first time in six years. The contest will now feature 20 top awards-10 for males, 10 for femalesof at least \$20,000. The 20 top finalists will participate in a Leadership Weekend in Chicago during which they'll interview with the national judges. These finalists will be vying for two first-place awards of \$50,000; two second-place awards of \$40,000; and two third-place awards of \$30,000. The remaining 480 runners-up will receive fifth-place scholarships of \$4,000. In addition, the ENF doubled the 2013-14 Beacon Grant amount to \$2,000. With twice as many funds, Lodges will be able to do twice as much to meet local needs.

Applications for Freedom Grants are online only and will be accepted from August 1 through August 31, 2013.
