Drug Quiz Show Reaches Kids

The Drug Quiz Show appeals to students because it encourages involvement on many different levels such as teamwork. artwork and peer coaching. The program appeals to volunteers because it makes them feel good, knowing they're doing something positive and meaningful for the young people in their community.

Through the Elks Drug Quiz Show, teams of middle school students learn about the dangers of drug use by participating in an excitiing game show.

The concept of a TV game show was originated by Jennifer Shulman, an insightful eighth grader who knew what would appeal to others her age. It was originally conceived in response to a confidential substance use survey completed by seventh through twelfth graders in the Jamesville DeWitt School District in DeWitt NY in 1984. The survey results, which paralled national facts and figures, found that drug abuse was as much a local issue as it was a natonal problem. As a result, parents, teachers, administrators and students formed a group to fight back. Based on the latest research on effective measures in drug abuse prevention and education, the first Drug Quiz Show was held in October

Thirty plus years of experience with all types of fifth through eighth graders in public, private and parochial schools located in urban, suburban and rural settings have proven Shulman's thinking right.

The Drug Quiz Show has grown and prospered over the years. Its sponsorship remained mainly with drug store chains, but in 2011, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks took over leadership of the program.

With pride in our progress and greater hope for the future, we look forward to the day when all fifth thru eighth graders will have this exciting opportunity.
